UDHNA COLLEGE JOINS THE RANKS OF INSTITUTIONS RECOGNIZED UNDER SECTION 2(F) OF UGC ACT

Exciting news for all the students of Udhna College! The college has recently been included in the list of colleges recognized under Section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Act, 1956. Our college is the first among the SFIs affiliated to VNSGU to achieve this feat. If you're wondering what Section 2(f) is and why it's essential to be aware of it, then this article is for you. This article will provide you with a comprehensive understanding of Section 2(f) of the UGC Act and its significance. Whether you are a student or an academician, it's essential to be familiar with this section as it affects the financial assistance and development programs that colleges and universities can avail themselves of.

The main objective of the University Grants Commission (UGC) is to promote and coordinate higher education in India. The UGC is responsible for the maintenance of standards in higher education and for ensuring that universities and colleges provide

high-quality education to their students. For ensuring this UGC performs following roles:

- To provide funds for the development of universities and colleges in India.
- To promote innovation and excellence in higher education.
- To ensure the proper distribution of funds to universities and colleges.
- To determine the standards of teaching, examination, and research in universities.
- To encourage the development of new courses and programs in universities and colleges.
- To promote the use of technology in higher education.
- To provide financial assistance to meritorious students from economically weaker sections to enable them to pursue higher education.

To understand the eligibility for financial assistance, it is important to consider Section 2(f) and 12(B) of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Act 1956. Section 2(f) of UGC Act, 1956 defines a college as an institution of higher education that is affiliated to a university and provides courses of study leading to degrees or diplomas awarded by the



university. Section 2(f) also empowers UGC to recognize such colleges and bring under its purview. The UGC has notified Regulations for recognition of college Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956. The colleges have to apply to UGC in a prescribed format and meet the criteria and norms specified by UGC for inclusion under Section 2(f). Section 12(B) of UGC Act, 1956 declares that only those colleges that are included under Section 2(f) and are fit to receive central assistance from the Government of India or any organisation receiving funds from the Central Government can be eligible for grants from UGC. Section 12(B) also empowers UGC to include such colleges in a list maintained by it and provide financial assistance to them as per approved pattern of assistance under various schemes viz.:

Development Grants: These grants are provided to universities and institutions to support their infrastructure development, including the construction of buildings, purchase of equipment, and other related expenses.

Research Grants: UGC provides financial assistance to universities and institutions for undertaking research projects in various fields of study. The research grants cover expenses related to research, such as the purchase of equipment, payment of stipends to research scholars, and other related expenses.

Special Assistance Programme (SAP): SAP is a scheme of UGC that provides financial assistance to universities and institutions to promote excellence in teaching and research. Under this scheme, the UGC provides grants to universities and institutions to establish Centres of Excellence, Departments of Special Assistance, and other related activities.



Faculty Improvement Programme (FIP): The FIP is a scheme of UGC that provides financial assistance to universities and institutions to enhance the qualifications and skills of their faculty members. The FIP covers expenses related to the training of faculty members, including the payment of fees, travel expenses, and other related expenses.

Scholarship and Fellowship Schemes: UGC provides various scholarship and fellowship schemes to support the education and research of students and scholars. These schemes cover expenses related to the tuition fees, accommodation, and other related expenses of the beneficiaries.

Therefore, every student who wants to pursue higher education in India and the one who wants to build a career in higher education must consider recognition of college under Section 2f and/or Section 12B of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Act, 1956.
